## Can We Talk? Striking a Balance with Your College Student

As a parent, you knew many things would change when your child left for college. Parenting college students is different and parents often find themselves struggling to find the right balance. It can be difficult to transition to the role of follower after years of acting as the leader.

"College is a time where students may need to develop the skills to manage their own lives, and parents may need to allow their students the freedom to develop these skills," explained Carrie Park, Psy.D., senior staff psychologist at the Claremont University Consortium's Monsour Counseling and Psychological Services Center. "It's a growth process for both parents and students."

"Communication," Park said, "is key." Joshua Weiner, a child and adolescent psychiatrist practicing in the Washington, D.C. area, agreed. "The best thing for parents to do is to sit down with your kids and say, 'This is a big move," Weiner continued. "We support your independence but want you to know that we are available and here for you."

He advised parents to ask their students how often they'd like to talk and come home. Recently, a patient who is a new college student complained that his parents were calling the student constantly and that he felt guilty for ignoring their calls. "He was afraid to tell his mom how he felt, but I suggested he be direct and say, 'Hey Mom, I know that you call me every day, but it's hard to talk every day.' They needed to come up with a compromise." Read more.
