
### Keeping Students Safe: Emergency Management at CMC

Colleges across America are evaluating security and how to best keep students safe while at the same time maintaining campus intimacy and providing a secure learning environment. The same is true at CMC.

One thing is for sure: good communication is the key to crisis response. The primary mode of safety communications at CMC is cell phone and email push alerts. The catch—students have to access their CMC student portal to provide mobile numbers, personal email addresses, and communication preferences.

Stan Skipworth, director of Campus Safety for The Claremont Colleges, says that Claremont students have to "opt out" of communications (unlike some of the other Claremont Colleges where students "opt in" for communications), but cautions that students need to provide current mobile numbers.
