**WELCOME** to the families of the Class of 2021 and transfer students, and welcome back to returning families! Here's hoping that every student has a great year of academic and personal growth!

As Co-Vice Presidents of Communication for the Parent Network Board, our goal is to share relevant and unique information, and to help you connect with other CMC families. The beginning of the school year is a great time to visit some of the CMC communication channels—and review some forms you may want your student to fill out.

**WEBSITE:** CMC's website is a terrific resource. Check out the Families Gateway Page. You may also take note of a few specific items to get the year

started off right:

**Calendars:** The current year academic calendar, projected academic calendar and dorm open/close schedule can be found here. These can be helpful as you make travel plans.

**Student Health Forms:** Student Health Services (SHS) complies with all state and federal regulations pertaining to confidentiality of medical records. The <u>Release of Medical Records and Medical Information</u> allows students to authorize the sharing of their health related information with parents and other providers.

**Student Grades:** CMC complies with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), which states that any student 18 or older (or who attends a secondary school) has the sole right of access to their academic records. This means that all academic information—including grades—goes directly to the student. For a third party (like a parent) to access a student's academic records, the student must submit a signed <u>FERPA Release</u>, *in person*, to the Registrar's Office. (Scanned email is permitted if the student is studying off campus). The form must be resubmitted *each academic year*.

This is a change for parents who are used to receiving report cards. The CMC Office of the Registrar believes that access to student records works best when additional support may be beneficial—not as a means to routinely "keep tabs" on a student. Best bet? Talk to your student about how to share academic progress in a way that works for all of you.
