
DISCOVER THE AMAZING GALÁPAGOS UNDERSEA

The Galápagos underwater is vibrant and as full of interesting creatures as the land. It's half the experience, vital to your understanding. During your voyage, you will have many opportunities to snorkel, paddleboard, and kayak. You'll see acrobatic sea lions, Pacific green sea turtles, and passing penguins. You might swim amid white-tipped reef sharks or a cloud of colorful fish, or see a blue-footed booby plunge in to spear dinner. There's complete snorkeling gear aboard, exclusively yours for the duration. You'll also be able to cruise by glass-bottom Zodiac or view video footage, presented by the Undersea Specialist on the lounge's 4K TV screens, to further enrich your understanding.

Pack a ton of adventure into one action-filled week. With multiple activities each day on land and under the sea—including options for walks and hikes, kayaking, paddleboarding, and snorkeling—you'll enjoy the full Galápagos experience.

DAY 1: DEPART U.S./GUAYAQUIL, ECUADOR

Arrive in Guayaquil and transfer to the 44-room Hotel del Parque (or similar), a tranquil haven set in a restored 19th-century building. Call for recommended international flights, or additional nights at the hotel.

DAY 2: GUAYAQUIL/GALÁPAGOS/EMBARK

Fly to Santa Cruz in the center of Galápagos, a little world unto itself in the tropical Pacific Ocean. You are welcomed by the naturalist staff and start exploring the islands. (B,L,D)

DAYS 3-6: GALÁPAGOS

Listed is a sample of islands we may visit during our expedition. Our expedition sails between Santa Cruz and Baltra, and includes visits to a careful selection of diverse islands. Our itinerary offers an optimal balance of wildlife, landscapes and experiences. All itineraries are subject to Galápagos National Park regulations. (B,L,D Daily)



SANTA CRUZ: Visit Puerto Ayora, the largest town and headquarters of both the Galápagos National Park and Charles Darwin Research Station. See the monument to Lonesome George, and tour the giant tortoise breeding corral. Observe the giant tortoises roaming in the wild in the lush, green highlands.

SAN CRISTÓBAL: Search for redfooted boobies and the endemic mockingbird and lava lizard—found only on this easternmost island, and

dig your toes into the powdery white sand at a gorgeous beach fronted by iconic Kicker Rock. Explore Baquerizo Moreno and surroundings, home to one of the largest sea lion rookeries.

ESPAÑOLA: See swallow-tailed gulls, Española mockingbirds, Nazca boobies, and, seasonally, the world's only population of waved albatross at this birder's paradise, also home to vividly colored marine iguanas. Watch sea lions on the wide sand beach, and snorkel offshore, at Gardner Bay.

FLOREANA: Follow a trail past a rose pink-tinted lagoon frequented by flamingos. Snorkel among sea lions a abundant fish, or cruise along Champion Islet by Zodiac. Visit the famous barrel at Post Office Bay.

DAY 7: DISEMBARK/BALTRA/GUAYAQUIL

Disembark in Baltra and return by air to Guayaquil, where we enjoy the Hotel del Parque. (B)

DAY 8: GUAYAQUIL/DEPART

Stay and relax or take an early flight home today. (B)

CAPACITY: 26 suites accommodating 48 guests.

REGISTRY: Ecuador. OVERALL LENGTH: 280 feet.

PUBLIC SPACES: Expansive Observation Deck with grill and bar, fitness center, sauna, outdoor showers, and plunge pool; Outdoor Patio Café and Yacht Club Restaurant; Cove lounge newly outfitted for state-of-the-art presentations for all guests, with full-service bar; Forward viewing platforms and expansive surrounding teak decks encircling the ship; Science Hub with interactive video display, onboard television network, photo kiosks and versatile lab facilities; Reception, chart room, Global Gallery, library and beverage center. Newly expanded marina with gearing up and snorkel areas, Zodiac boarding, and swim platform.

MEALS: Indoor-outdoor dining with Ecuadorian flair served in a single, unassigned seating in the Patio Café and Yacht Club. The atmosphere is sociable and informal, and menus feature local, sustainable ingredients.

All suites have large windows, convertible king/twin beds, ample closets, marble double-sink bathrooms, available Wi-Fi, stocked mini-bar, flat screen television with shipboard network.

EXPEDITION TOOLS: Zodiac Mark V boats for landings and cruising, custom-built glass bottom Zodiac, fleet of kayaks and stand-up paddleboards, snorkel gear for adults and children, science hub equipped for oceanography, video editing and screenings, video microscope, remote cameras.



This photocatalytic cleaning process activates when illuminated, continuously breaking down unwanted microbes such as bacteria, viruses, mold, and

airborne allergens. The positive environmental impacts of this non-toxic, chemical-free system are many: less plastic in the supply chain and waste stream, and more than one million gallons of water saved annually. The system lowers our carbon footprint and creates a cleaner, healthier shipboard environment for guests and crew alike.

VOYAGE COST INCLUDES: All accommodations aboard ship or in hotels per itinerary; all meals, nonalcoholic and alcoholic (except certain premium brands) beverages aboard ship; meals on land as indicated; shore excursions, sightseeing, and entrance fees; special access permits; transfers to and from group flights; use of snorkeling equipment and wetsuits; use of kayaks and paddleboards; free Wi-Fi aboard ship (one hour per day, per person); taxes, and service charges; services of the ship's physician and our expedition staff. Unused services or items included in this program are non-refundable.

NOT INCLUDED: Air transportation; extensions; passport, visa and immigration fees; meals not indicated; certain premium brands of alcohol; travel protection plan; items of a personal nature, such as wellness treatments, and laundry. Gratuities to ship's crew are at your discretion.

AIRFARE: Airfare is an additional cost. International and internal Ecuador tickets must be issued separately. Sample international fares: Round-trip Miami/Guayaquil: Economy from \$425; Business from \$1,425. Internal fares: Round-trip Guayaquil/Galápagos: Adult from \$520; Children (under 12) from \$350. Lindblad Expeditions will assist in making your international air arrangements for a \$50 per person service fee. Fares subject to change.

RESERVATIONS: To confirm your place, an advance payment of 15% of the cabin fare per person is required at the time of reservation and is payable by Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Discover or check. Receipt of advance payment indicates your acceptance of the terms and conditions.

FINAL PAYMENT: Payment is due 120 days prior to departure. Lindblad Expeditions reserves the right to cancel your reservation if payment has not been received by final payment due date.

TRAVEL PROTECTION PLAN: Travel and medical insurance are available at an additional cost.

ENTRY AND VISA REQUIREMENTS: Guests are advised to verify travel documents (passport/transit visa/entry visa) for the country(s) through which they are transiting and/or entering. Reliable and most current information regarding international travel can be found by contacting the consulate/embassy of the country(s) you are visiting or transiting through. We will not be responsible if you are denied entry or transit into a country if you are unable to provide valid documents as per the country's requirement.


